I have worked hard to earn her trust, and I am beginning to see the fruits of my labor. She allows me close to her without pinning her ears or walking away. Recently I was able to successfully ride her for the first time. We still have a long way to go, but God is using her to teach me the importance of pursuing

relationship with others.

Blazing Hope Ranch has become a true sanctuary for me while I am in Tennessee. My time in college has been far from easy; it's practically broken me. But I have found healing in a quiet little spot on the mountain. There I can hurt, but I can also find release in the comforting strength of four horses, and the people who take care of them. Their love for Jesus is evident and they extend that same love to me. I don't

know what I would have done without them, and I am thankful that God brought us all together.

I am so excited to see what future He has in store for Blazing Hope and all who find shelter there. 
